3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Continental Divide Na-

5 tional Scenic Trail Completion Act".

6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.

7 In this Act:

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1	(1) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
2	the Secretary of Agriculture.
3	(2) TRAIL.—The term "Trail" means the Con-
4	tinental Divide National Scenic Trail.
5	(3) TRAIL COMPLETION TEAM.—The term
6	"Trail Completion Team" means the joint Forest
7	Service-Bureau of Land Management Trail comple-
8	tion team established under section 4(a).
9	SEC. 3. COMPLETION OF CONTINENTAL DIVIDE NATIONAL
10	SCENIC TRAIL.
11	Subject to the availability of appropriations, the Sec-
12	retary and the Secretary of the Interior shall seek to com-
13	plete the Trail as a continuous route not later than 10
14	years after the date of enactment of this Act.
15	SEC. 4. TRAIL COMPLETION TEAM.
16	(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after the
17	date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary and the Sec-
18	retary of the Interior shall establish a joint Forest Service-
19	Bureau of Land Management Trail completion team to
20	work in coordination with the administrator of the Trail—
21	(1) to facilitate the completion and optimization
22	of the Trail, consistent with the purposes of the
23	Trail; and

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(2) to assist in the development of the com-1 2 prehensive development plan for the Trail under sec-3 tion 5. 4 (b) CONSULTATION.—As appropriate, the Trail Com-5 pletion Team shall consult with other Federal agencies, 6 affected State, Tribal, and local governments, landowners, 7 affected land-grant mercedes owners and users, acequias, 8 and other interested parties in— 9 (1) the completion and optimization of the 10 Trail; and 11 (2) the development and completion of the com-12 prehensive development plan for the Trail under sec-13 tion 5. 14 SEC. 5. COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE 15 CONTINENTAL DIVIDE NATIONAL SCENIC 16 TRAIL. 17 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 3 years after the 18 date of establishment of the Trail Completion Team under 19 section 4(a), the Secretary shall complete a comprehensive 20 development plan for the Trail. 21 (b) PLAN INCLUSIONS.—The comprehensive develop-22 ment plan under subsection (a) shall— 23 (1) identify any gaps in the Trail for which the 24 Secretary and the Secretary of the Interior have not 25 been able to acquire land;

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(2) identify opportunities for the use of ease ments acquired from willing sellers to facilitate com pletion of the Trail; and

4 (3) include general and site-specific Trail devel5 opment plans, including anticipated costs of the
6 plans.

7 SEC. 6. PARTNERSHIPS.

8 The Secretary and the Secretary of the Interior shall 9 seek to enter into agreements with volunteer and nonprofit 10 organizations, as appropriate, to facilitate the completion 11 and administration of the Trail.

12 SEC. 7. EFFECT.

13 Nothing in this Act—

(1) provides any authority to acquire land or interests in land for inclusion in the Trail beyond the
authorities provided for the Trail in the National
Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1241 et seq.), including acquisition by eminent domain; or

19 (2) makes the acquisition of land or interests in
20 land for the Trail a priority over other land acquisi21 tion authorizations.
